### Teacher of the Week Miss Mangold (Wombat-Kindergarten)

# What have you enjoyed about teaching the Wombats this year?

I have been very fortunate to work with the Wombat Class teacher since Term 2 this year. Since I have been teaching the Wombat class I have been so impressed by how much they have learnt. They have made huge progress in literacy and numeracy and have learnt the role of a student very well. Their amazing learning journey has been wonderful for Miss Cherie and I to be a part of.

# What has been your favourite memory from 2016 so far?

My favourite memory would be watching the Wombat and Wallaroo class perform the 'Scarf Dance' at assembly. After practising for many weeks with Mrs Landstra, I was very proud to see how confident and happy the Wombat class were up on stage. It was great to see so many parents there watching us perform too!

# What have your class been learning about in literacy and numeracy?

In literacy we have been focusing on becoming independent writers. During our writing sessions we have been constructing wonderful pieces of writing by illustrating then writing. Our planning has really helped our writing to become even more interesting and we love going back and adding more detail to it each day. We have also been learning how to edit our work. In reading, we practice our home readers everyday. We have been learning to read our stories fluently, using expression and to change our voices when we see speech marks. In numeracy, we have been learning all about making equal groups. Our favourite game is clumps. We have all been practising our counting to 100, some of us can even count past 100! We have also been learning to count by 2's, 5's & 10's.

### What are you looking forward to this term?

This term we are exciting about going on our end of year Picnic Day excursion. We are very excited about this. We are catching the bus and the Year 1 and 2 students' are coming too! It will be so much fun, we can't wait!

# Who is your student of the week and why?
