Student Reports

All teachers are currently writing the end of year student reports. These are scheduled to be issued to parents on **Friday 9 December**. In order for parents to have a clear understanding of the reports, I want clarify a number of point of confusion.

N/A – if a student receives this grade next to a curriculum area it means that the student has not completed that particular unit or topic of work. This may be for a variety of reasons but the most common is that students have been away for the work or are new to the school and did not attend any of the lessons.

'C' is fantastic. This is the grade we expect children to achieve. However, we all know that children learn at different rates and not all will achieve a 'C'. Those who have some difficulty may receive a 'D' or an 'E', while others who excel with their learning may receive a 'B' or an 'A'.

Regardless of the grade your child has received, it is most import that you acknowledge how hard they have tried and to keeping working hard. Improvement will come to those who keep trying.

Below is a brief summary of the Department of Education's descriptions for the A-E scale. If you require further explanation please contact your child's teacher.

A-E Scale

A or **Outstanding:** The student has an **extensive** knowledge and understanding of the content and **can readily apply** this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved **a very high** level of competence in the processes and skills and **can apply these** skills to **new** situations

B or **High:** The student has a **thorough** knowledge and understanding of the content and **a high** level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student **is able to apply** this knowledge and these skills **to most** situations.

C or **Sound:**The student has a **sound** knowledge and understanding of **the main areas** of content and has achieved **an adequate** level of competence in the processes and skills.

D or **Basic:**The student has a **basic_**knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a **limited** level of competence in the processes and skills

E or **Limited:**The student has an **elementary** knowledge and understanding in **few areas** of the content and has achieved **very limited** competence in some of the processes and skills

Code of Ethics

The Department of Education's Code of Ethics states that all employees of the Department must show dignity and respect by avoiding behaviour which is, or might reasonably be perceived as, harassing, bullying or intimidating. They must maintain professional relationships with:

In extreme cases, I have the right to prevent parents from entering onto the school grounds under the Enclosed Lands Protection Act 1901.

Disputes between families and individuals must be left outside the school gates in order to protect our students from unwanted exposure to verbal abuse and inappropriate behaviour. I look forward to everyone maintaining the high standard of behaviour at Nowra East Public School and not tolerating bad parent behaviour in front of our kids.
